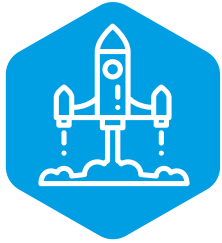

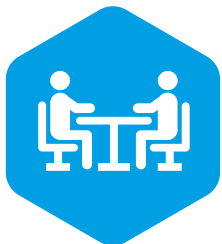

Buckinghamshire Business Festival

The Buckinghamshire Business Festival is the jewel in our business support crown – and this past year, we staged two festivals!

The first ever online Buckinghamshire Business Festival in April 2021 was a message of defiance and resilience, coming together by whatever means necessary in the circumstances. Nearly 50 businesses signed up as sponsors of the festival, reaping all the benefits of being associated with the fortnight of activity.



The festival was back in-person in March 2022 with more than 60 events covering topics ranging from exporting to finance, PR to first aid, apprenticeships to HR, digital marketing to CSR, business planning to skills, and cyber security to start-up support, with lots of networking thrown in too!

The festivals feel like both a culmination of all of the support on offer to businesses, whether from ourselves, our partners or members of the business community, but also like the beginning of another era of support for businesses, highlighting new projects, new relationships and new opportunities.

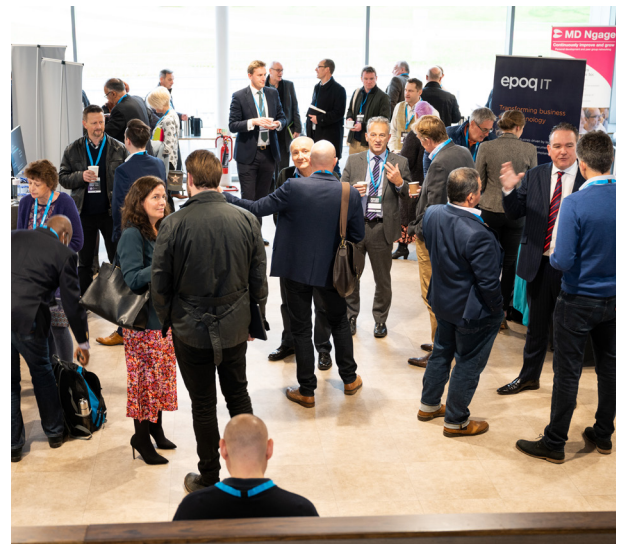
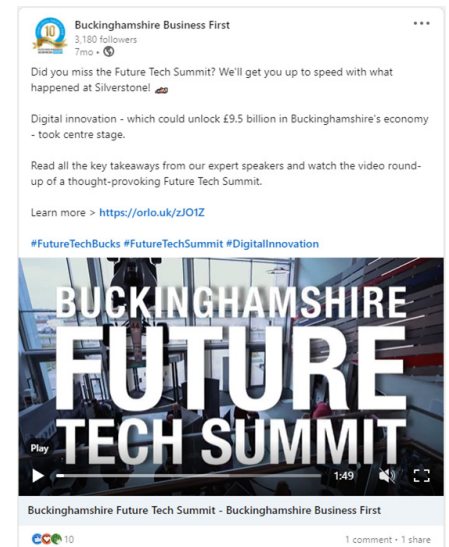
Buckinghamshire Future Tech Summit

The business: Business services provider selling everything from stationery to hygiene supplies.

The problem: Stuck in the day-to-day running of the business, Director Grahame Barnes wanted to leave his comfort zone and get others to challenge his ideas, including on how they could promote their wide range of support.

The solution: Grahame joined other business owners in a Peer Networks group where a PR specialist identified Grahame's customer comms issue, resulting in hiring a marketing agency to spread their message far and wide.

The Massage Company High Wycombe

The business: Offering massage treatments that build regular wellbeing into people's lifestyle.

The problem: Running a touch-based business in the back-end of 2020, Mark Coldham was keen to see how other owners had managed their way through the "treacle" of the pandemic and to tap into shared solutions for common problems.

The solution: Mark's Peer Networks group came up with fresh ideas to help him think through various business challenges, from day-to-day issues to specifics such as how to talk with his commercial landlord about closures and rent payments.

Be Your Own Boss

We have added another string to our start-up business support, launching a series of online 'bitesize' events due to popular demand for 'out-of-hours' virtual events. The free evening events are split into distinct sessions, run over three weeks:

- Session 1 focuses on the basics, the legal requirements, what running a business entails, and whether it is the right path for an individual.
- Session 2 covers creating revenue, interacting with customers, pricing, marketing and forecasting.
- Session 3 outlines the importance of cashflow, the key activities behind running a business, learning what resources are needed, who a business will be dependent on, and the costs involved.

The bitesize events complement our long-standing support in the form of Enterprise Days, two-day intensive courses and 1-2-1 support from experienced advisers. Due to their success, we have added more bitesize events to our 2022/23 Be Your Own Boss programme.

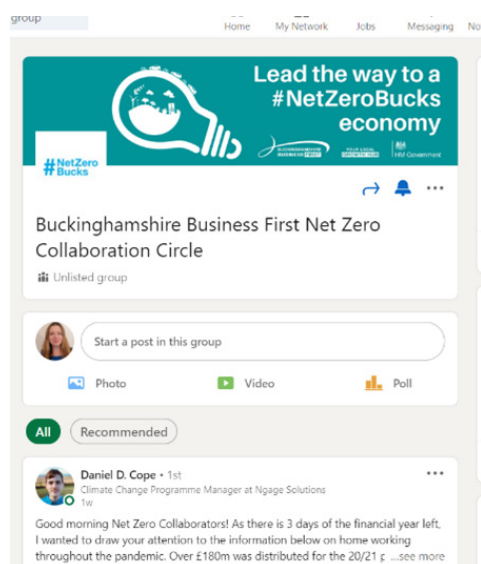
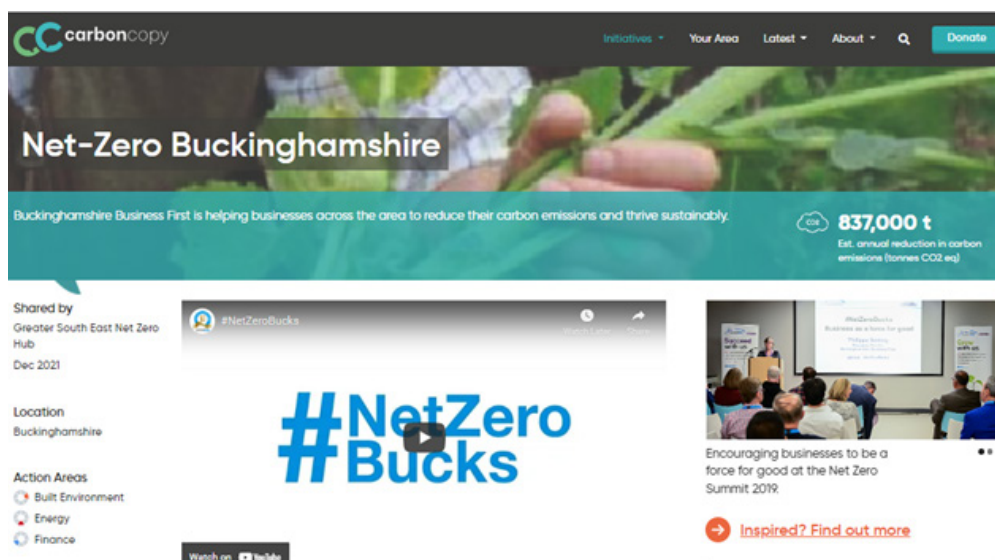
Working together for a Net Zero Buckinghamshire

Workforce skills

Employers are constantly having to think about the skills of their workforce, staff training requirements, and recruitment. Thanks to our Business Support Team and the Buckinghamshire Skills Hub, employers have a constant source of support and information to ensure they can recruit the right people for their needs, access funding and support for training, and help their staff fulfil their potential.

Whether it was businesses facing skills shortages, looking for help recruiting staff, seeking guidance to hire apprentices, or looking for information on the government Kickstart Scheme which funded six-month work placements for out-of-work young people, our team was on hand to help.

One of the great resources for employers in this area is the Bucks Skills Hub website, which lists over 6,000 jobs in the county and is proving a valuable resource for employers. 'Demystifying Apprenticeships' – in partnership with Bucks College Group, we ran six workshops throughout the year to help employers understand the ins and outs of apprenticeships and reassure those uncertain of going down that route.

Underpinning all of this support is the [2022 Buckinghamshire Local Skills Report](#), published in January, which gets to the heart of understanding and resolving the skills and recruitment challenges in Buckinghamshire. One of the great resources for employers in this area is the Bucks Skills Hub website bucksskillshub.org

From Kickstart Scheme to full-time job in two months



Over the course of one summer, Mohammed Abdal went from never having had a job to starting a six-month work contract at Buckinghamshire Business First via the government Kickstart Scheme, to accepting

a full-time job with BBF just two months into that contract. Quite the kickstart to his working life!

Reducing the cost of training and upskilling staff



The business: Nicab Ltd, a specialised cabling business based in Silverstone, employing 11 people.

The problem: Having to make a considerable financial investment in training staff, enrolling

two members of staff (accounts and purchasing managers) on certified professional training courses, at a cost of £1,500 each, paid to private training providers.

The solution: By engaging with BBF's Business Support Team, Nicab's Managing Director Nick Locke discovered that the courses could be delivered as part of an apprenticeship and were eligible for government funding covering 95% of the cost of training. A considerable saving!

Mentoring

Whether it's one go-to mentor or different people for different subjects, business owners can lean on the support and encouragement of people that have been in their position.

Our Mentoring Programme connects businesses with experienced mentors who help them develop their skills and maximise their potential by acting as a sounding board and prompting new ways of thinking.

The mentors are business owners themselves, experienced across a wide range of sectors (include examples), who have overcome similar challenges to their mentees.

There was no shortage of willing mentors – 15 volunteer business owners were selected and trained to be mentors. We know what to look out for when choosing business owners who know what they are talking about to advise others – most of our Business Support Team have run their own business too!
